## Title I Parent Information



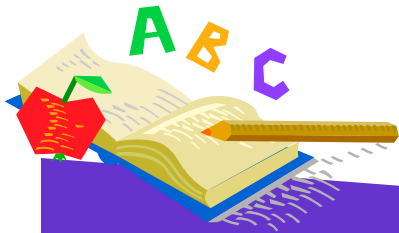
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## What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal aid program for elementary, middle, and high schools. Through Title I, money is allocated to school districts around the country based on the number of low-income families in each district. Each district uses its Title I money for extra services for children in need of educational help. The focus of the Title I program is to help all students meet the same high standards expected of all children.



## How may Title I funds be used?

- Class size reduction
- After-school tutoring
- Before-school tutoring
- Instructional materials and supplies
- Additional teachers and/or para-professionals
- Parent/Family Involvement funds
- Data system to help monitor student progress
- Additional professional development for school staff

Title I serves children in six elementary campuses in the Central Dauphin School district, including Paxtang.
