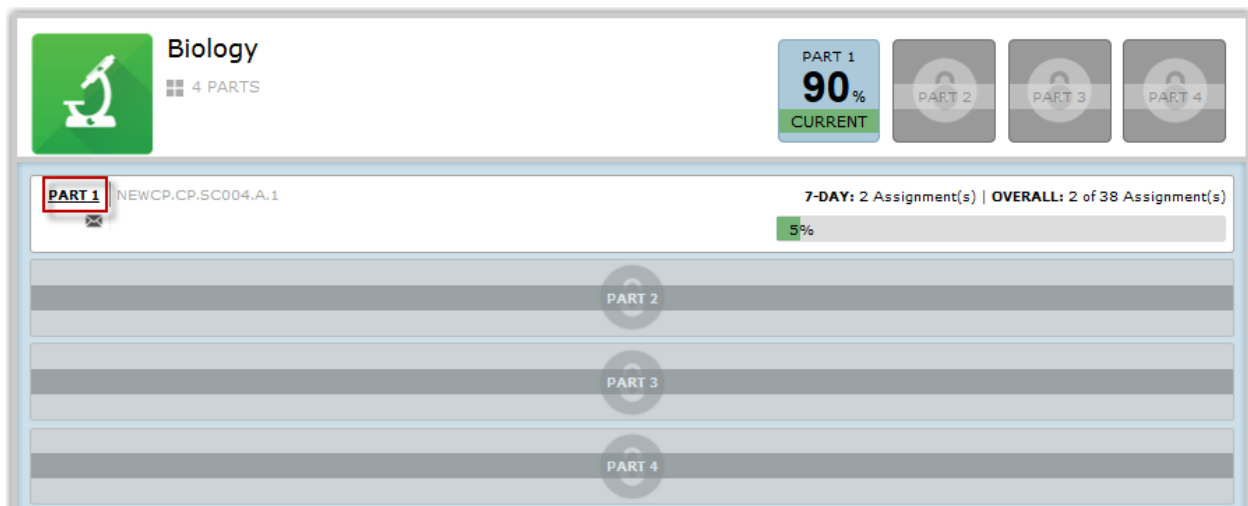


Course Player

To open the new Course Player

You can launch the course delivery system in the same fashion as you would have before by clicking the course icon and selecting the desired part, make sure that all pop-up blocker(s) you may have installed are **turned off**.



To navigate within the new Course Player

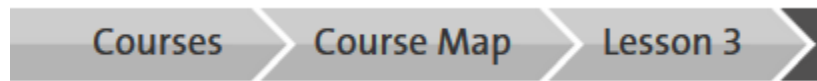
Once the course loads, you will be presented with the first learning object within the lesson, most often the Need to Know (N2K) introductory set.

After you are done viewing each learning object, there will be a "**Done**" button on the screen. You must click that button to move forward to the next learning object.



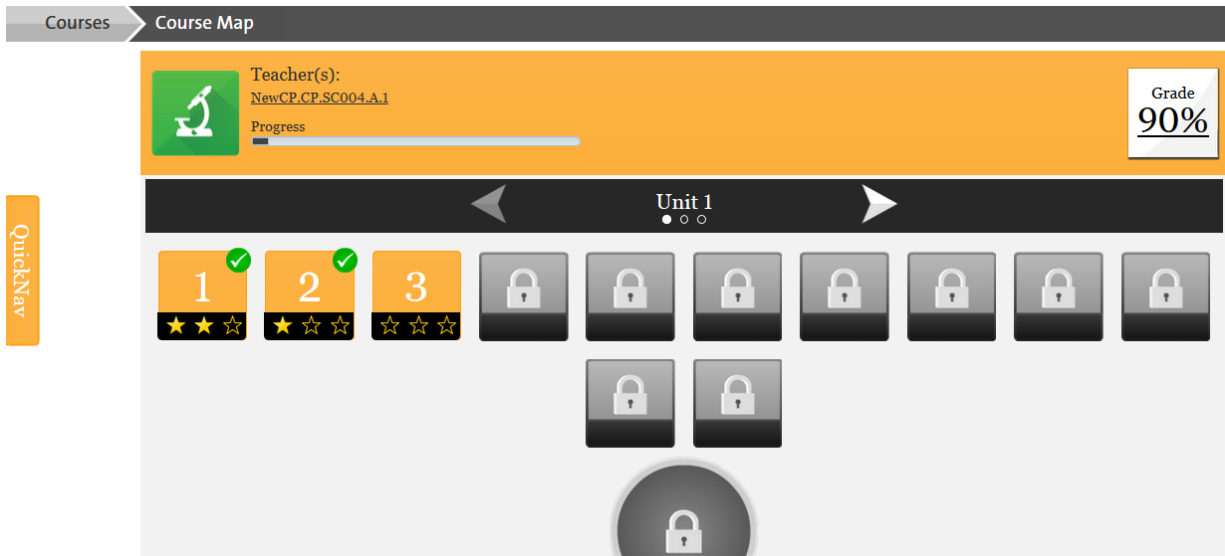
A difference you may notice is that in the new course delivery system we can control the order in which the learning objects appear on a per course basis. As a result the lesson flows may be different than what you are accustomed to.

Once within course player you can navigate freely by using the breadcrumb buttons at the top of the page.



Courses - this button will display all applicable course enrollments to you.

Course Map - this button will display all unlocked units and lessons of the course you are viewing as seen in the screen shot below.



Lesson - this button will display all learning objects within the lesson and allow you to access them if unlocked.

To take an assignment

Below is what the assignment splash screen looks like, this should be familiar to the flash version of course player. Click the **Enter** or **Resume** button to access the assignment.

QuickNav bar

The QuickNav menu is available by clicking its tab on the left of the course page. When clicked, the tab expands to display the following options:

Course Map – Returns you to the course selection screen.

Forum – Takes you to the course's forums.

Calculator – Opens a calculator for immediate use.

Traditional View - This will open up a read only preview of the entire course.

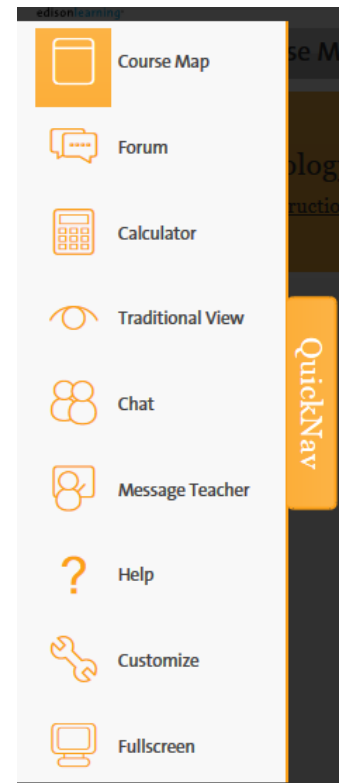
Chat – This will open up an interface that will allow you to interact with any teachers that are immediately available for tutoring purposes.

Message Teacher – Clicking this will open a pop up which will allow you to quickly message your teacher if needed.

Help – Clicking this will take you to the build in help page for eSchoolware.

Customize – Displays options to change the course page colors.

Full Screen - Displays the course as a full screen within your browser



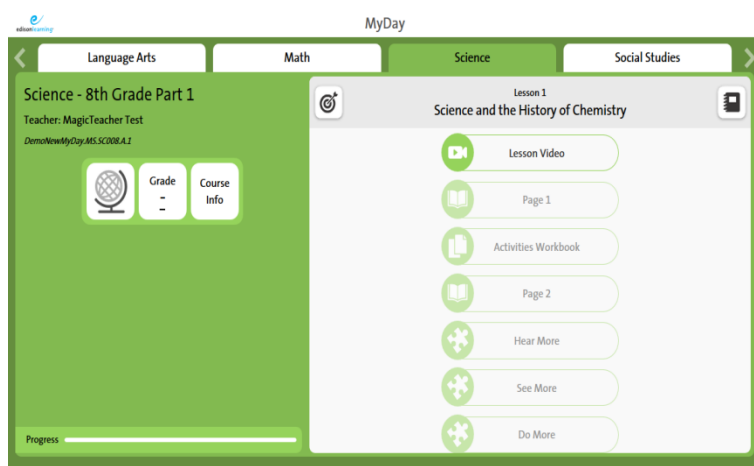
MyDay

To open the new MyDay

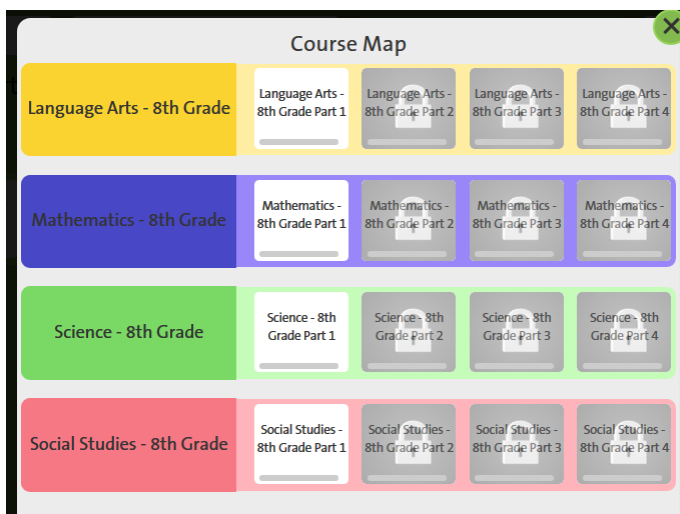
You can launch the course delivery system in the same fashion as you would have before by clicking the MyDay button at the top of your page. You can also click the course icon and select the desired part, make sure that pop up blocker is **turned off**.



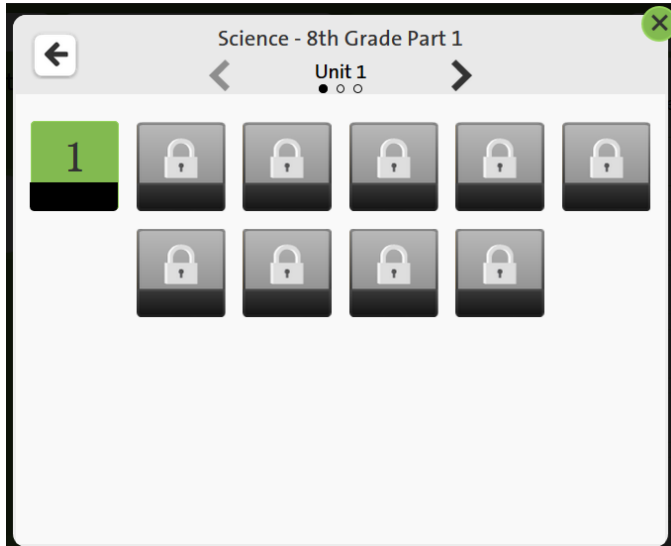
Each course you are enrolled into will appear along the top of the page, click the course subject area you would like to view.



Another method of navigation would be the Learning Log (globe icon). Clicking that icon will reveal your full list of actively enrolled courses. After you click the globe icon you will be presented with the Course Map as seen to the left. This will allow you to navigate freely as needed.

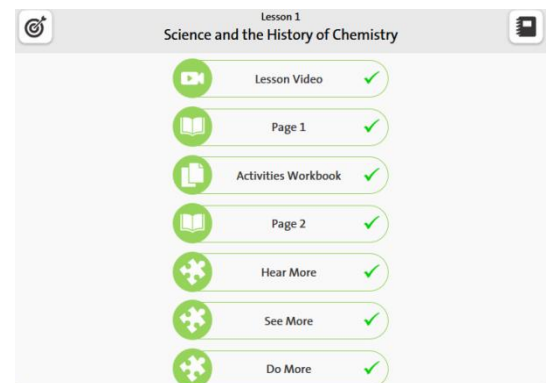


After selecting the course you would like to view next, you can use the navigational arrows available to view anything you have unlocked within that course.



Task List

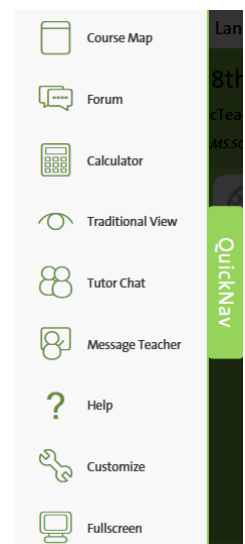
The list of daily tasks you need to complete for each subject appears on the right page of the planner upon entry to a lesson. Depending on the lesson flow for that course, the number of learning objects and the order they appear in may vary.



Quick Nav Bar

The QuickNav tab is located to the left within MyDay. Click the tab to open the bar and click again to close it. This toolbar contains a number of useful links and tools.

- Course Map - Returns you to the course selection screen.
- Forum - Takes you to the course's forums. See the forums section for details.
- Calculator - Opens a calculator for immediate use.
- Traditional View - This will open up a read only preview of the entire course
